[Words from Stanza XXIII, The Litanie, from “Divine Poems” by John Donne]

John Sykes set these words for double S.A.T.B. Choir in the early months of 1933, while he was a composition pupil of Vaughan Williams at the Royal College of Music. The manuscript is carefully presented in neat writing and bound in booklet form. This makes me wonder if it was part of his entry for the Arthur Sullivan Composition Prize in 1933, in which he was joint winner with Miriam Hyde.

(The award brought him the princely sum of £5 – a significant part of the termly fees of fourteen guineas!)

The major tempo changes are a problem if $\text{J} = \text{J}$ and $\text{J} = \text{J}$ are to be believed (the note values are reversed in the MS), especially as this does not agree with *piu allegro*. I suspect that they may be more an indication of where the beat lies than of a mathematical ratio.,
